How to Join RBHOO (2026)

RBHOO is an independent organization of Rarity Bay residents. It is open to anyone who owns property in Rarity Bay. There are two types of members:

Homeowner Member: A Homeowner Member is a person or family who lives in Rarity Bay, has a house under construction (i.e., a building permit has been issued), or owns a home that they rent. Homeowner Members may vote at the Annual Meeting and may hold office. Dues for Homeowners are currently \$25 per calendar year per household.

General Member: A General Member is a person or family who owns a lot in Rarity Bay, but does not live here, or someone who rents here without owning property. A General Member receives the same communications that all members receive but cannot vote or hold office. Dues for General Members are currently \$10 per calendar year per household.

Box 547, Vonore, TN 37885. Checks should be made out to RBHOO. Please note that if you join in October, November or December of any year, your dues will cover the following year.
