






Rarity Bay First Responders

- What: Tennessee Non-Profit Limited Liability Company
- When: Incorporated 11/29/2006
- Who: Board of Directors Rarity Bay volunteers Operations Team - Rarity Bay volunteers
- Mission: Provide Basic Life Support (BLS) until EMS arrives
- By-Laws: Updated in 2018 and recorded in Monroe County
- Fall under the Vonore Fire Department (VFD)
- Directed by the Monroe County Emergency Medical Services
- Protocols set by Monroe County Medical Director Dr. Popp
 - Scope of Practice
 - Standard of Care



- Board Responsibility
 - Ensure RBFR's have adequate funding
 - Sources of funding:
 - Donations from various Rarity Bay organizations/clubs
 - Donations from Rarity Bay residents
 - Donations from individuals RBFR's assist
 - Grants from Monroe and Loudon counties (\$1500 each)
 - 2024 Estimate is \$9,000
 - Pay the bills
 - On-going expenses
 - Training, insurance, supplies, etc.
 - 2024 Estimate is \$13,000
 - 2021 13 New AEDs were purchased; funded by a \$24,000 grant from Firehouse Subs
 - Old AEDs donated to Monroe County Sheriff's office
 - 2023 13 New radios were purchased
 - Expense to RBFR \$83,117.4; \$23,000 to Monroe County





- All EMR's are Licensed by the State of Tennessee
 - Attend 64+ hours of classroom instruction in BLS (Monroe EMS or Tellico Village Fire Dept.)
 - Pass CPR
 - Pass proficiency test
 - Pass 'hands-on' test
 - Pass National test
 - Continuing education each year
 - CPR basic life support including AED's (every two years)
 - TN EMR 10 hours
 - 7 Cardiac, Medical, Trauma
 - 2 Pediatric
 - 1 Preparatory
 - NREMT 16 hours total (every two years)
 - MCEMS TN EMR
 - 2 Hours Vanessa Free emergency vehicle driving
 - New for 2023
 - In-service training provided by our more experienced EMR's (certified EMT's)
 - Mike worked 40+ years as EMS, Paramedic, and EMT




- Chief stays for 2 years
 - Assistant chief moves to chief and new chief picks new assistant chief
- Radio's same that Monroe County EMS carries
 - Allows us to communicate with ambulance crew
 - Multi-band/multi-channel Digital, UHF, VHF
- All EMR's carry life saving emergency medical devices/supplies
 - Assessment tools
 - Oxygen sensor
 - Temperature
 - Blood Pressure/Heart Rate
 - Defibrillator (AED automatic electronic defibrillator)
 - Oxygen
 - Advance airway devices
 - Basic first aid supplies
 - Cervical Collars
 - Splints
- EMR's are only on duty when in Rarity Bay and available.




• How does it work?

- Call 911
- Call is routed based upon home phone number/location if cell phone
 - Loudon County
 - Loudon County 911 dispatch center takes down information
 - Calls Monroe County dispatch center
 - If Monroe county has ambulance available
 - RBFR are dispatched
 - Ambulance is dispatched out of Monroe County
 - No ambulance is available
 - RBFR are dispatched
 - Ambulance is dispatched out of Loudon County
 - Could be a delay
 - Monroe County
 - RBFR are dispatched
 - Ambulance is dispatched out of Monroe County
 - Usually, industrial park or Madisonville





TOTAL # OF CALLS

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INCIDENT TYPE STATISTICS

- What can <u>YOU</u> do to help!
 - If you're not sure; don't wait! Call 911
 - Lift assists are number 1 callout
 - Spouses/significant others/care givers don't hurt yourself trying to lift the patient
 - EMR's are usually on scene in less than 5 minutes
 - Don't call your friend that is an EMR call 911
 - Insurance only covers us when we are dispatched via 911 call center
 - Have a 911 light switch to assist EMR's identify which home
 - RBHOO has them (single pole) for \$30
 - Have a current list of medications on hand
 - Throw out old medications
 - Drop them off at CVS, Walgreens, Walmart, etc

- What can <u>YOU</u> do to help!
 - If there is a DNR, have it handy (tape it to the headboard)
 - If there is a Medical Power of Attorney; have it handy as well
 - If driving and someone is honking or blinking lights with emergency flashers on
 - Pull over and slow down
 - If you have hardwood/tile floors, wear socks that have 'grippers'
 - Keep your glasses and walker/cane nearby!
 - When in bed, have an easily accessible light!
 - Take your cell phone wherever you go!

- What can <u>YOU</u> do to help!
 - Volunteer
 - Board or Operations Team (EMR)
 - Contribute or ask your club/organization to contribute


